- Sleeping Bag & Pillow**
- Toiletries & Towel**
- Bible & Journal**
- Flashlight**
- Pajamas**
- Comfortable/casual clothes (layers for warmth)**
- Extra socks**
- Beanie**

- Sunblock, lip balm, and sunglasses** are helpful in dealing with the glare from the snow and sun.
- Snow boots** are highly encouraged to keep feet warm and dry during activities. If you don't have snow boots, rain boots with thick wool socks work as well. Another hack for staying dry in the snow is to secure a plastic bag in-between the sock and the shoe... might seem silly, but its better than cold, wet feet!
- Some spending money is optional**, our camp store will be open all weekend long. Campers can purchase everything from apparel to snacks.

MEDICAL INFO

MEDICATION - Please give all **properly marked medications** and/or supplements **in their original containers** (or clear photos of original containers included) to your church leader so that they may turn the medications into the infirmary upon arrival.

You do not need to send over the counter medications such as Tylenol, Advil, Sudafed, etc. We keep a well-stocked infirmary and we can "patch-up" most scrapes, bruises, headaches, and stomachaches. If your child brings ANY medication or vitamins, it must be turned into the infirmary. The health code mandates that no medications be left unattended in the cabins.

INJURY OR ILLNESS - If injuries or illnesses occur, a first aid certified staff member will tend to the camper. If a major illness or injury occurs, 911 will be called immediately and the camper will be transported to the hospital. Emergency personnel have approximately a five- minute response time to our facility. The parents of the camper will be contacted as soon as possible.
